FSDX SUMMARY

The Food Safety Data Exchange (FSDX) program is an initiative of the Partnership for Food Protection Information Technology Workgroup (PFP IT WG). It seeks to unify food safety data sharing and contribute to the public health goal of a safer food supply. It enables secure data exchange between FDA and regulatory partners to:



Improve Data Sharing Efficiency



Increase Collaboration



Reduce Dual Data Entry



Increase Data Standardization

DATA SHARING AREAS

3 areas of FSDX data sharing include: Inventory, Inspection, and Sample

PARTICIPATION

50 states and 2 US territories are onboarded for at least one FSDX capability

FSDX Portal

Web portal with user interface where regulatory partners and FDA users can submit and receive data

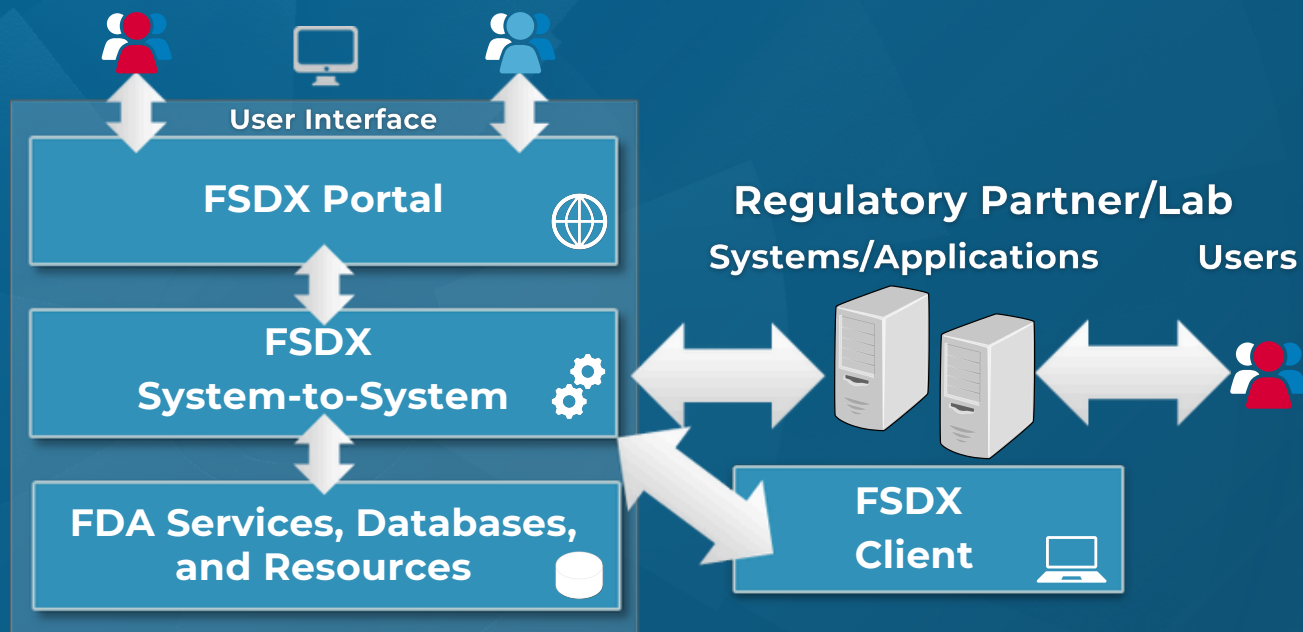


*FSDX System-to-System

Web services that connect state and FDA systems to enable electronic data exchange
